#### PURPOSE

To outline the grading system and requirements for pre-clinical and clinical coursework at IllinoisCOM, ensuring consistent and fair evaluation of student performance.

### POLICY

- 1. Pre-Clinical (OMSI and OMSII) Grading
  - Grade Options: Students will receive a final grade of either Honors (H), Pass (P), or Fail (F) for each required pre-clinical course.
    - Pass (P) will be awarded to students who earn at least 70% of available course points and satisfy all course requirements outlined in the syllabus
    - 2. Honors (H) will be awarded to the top 10% of students in each cohort based on the percentage of earned course points, and students must also satisfy all course requirements to receive Honors.
      - 1. Only first attempt exam scores will be used to determine Honors.
    - 3. Students who fail to meet these requirements will receive the grade of Fail (F) and require remediation.
- 2. Clinical (OMSIII and OMSIV) Grading
  - Grade Options: Students will receive a final grade of either Honors(H), Pass (P) or Fail (F) for each required rotation, course, sub-internship, or elective.

- 1. Pass (P) will be awarded to students who meet all clerkship grade requirements and pass the COMAT examination on the 1st or 2nd attempt.
  - 1. To achieve a grade of Pass, a student must receive a passing evaluation on the Clinical Competency Assessment, pass the COMAT examination on the first or second attempt, complete all required clerkship assignments, and complete all required evaluations.
- For core rotations, Honors (H) will be awarded to the top 10% of students in each cohort based on the first attempt COMAT score, completion of all clerkship requirements, and passing the Clinical Competency Assessment on the first attempt.
- Grade Requirements: Students who fail to complete the required elements of the clerkship in a timely manner will receive a grade of Fail (F) and require remediation.

# PROCEDURE

- 1. Pre-Clinical Reassessment Process (OMSI and OMSII):
  - For skills-based assessment failures, students will be afforded a reassessment opportunity after attending a Review and Feedback session.
  - For students falling below 70% on the graded course requirements will be administered a cumulative written assessment reflective of the course objectives.
  - Students requiring reassessment are not eligible for Honors. If a student passes the reassessment, they will obtain 70% of the allotted points for that assessment but are not eligible for Honors.
  - Students who do not pass the reassessment opportunity will be assigned a failing (F) grade and referred to the APPC to develop an Academic Development Plan (ADP).
- 2. Pre-Clinical Remediation Process (OMSI and OMSII):
  - Students failing a course will be required to complete the requirements outlined in the Academic Development Plan prescribed by the APPC.
  - The ADP may include completion of additional coursework or assignments, required meetings with academic support teams, behavioral requirements to address learning deficiencies, and other requirements determined by the Course Lead.
  - Upon successful completion of the course remediation process as prescribed by the APPC/ADP, the student will receive a grade of Pass (P\*), indicating a pass after remediation.
  - Students who do not successfully remediate the course failure will be referred to the APPC.
- 3. Clinical Reassessment Process (OMSIII and OMSIV):
  - Students who fail a COMAT examination on their first attempt will be allowed one additional attempt to pass at an individual expense to the student.
  - If a student passes the COMAT examination on the second attempt, they will receive a grade of Pass for the clerkship but are not eligible for Honors.
  - Students who fail the COMAT examination twice will receive a failing grade for the clerkship and be required to remediate the clerkship.
- 4. Clinical Competency Assessment Failure and Review Process:



- Students who receive a failing evaluation from their preceptors on the final Clinical Competency Assessment will receive a clerkship grade of Fail (F) and be required to formally remediate the clerkship.
- The Clerkship Director will review the preceptor's evaluation and the student's progress within the clerkship to determine the appropriate remediated action(s).
- If the Clerkship Director determines that the failing evaluation was due to factors beyond the student's control or that the student's performance does not warrant a failing grade, the Clerkship Director may override the preceptor's evaluation and assign a passing grade.
- If the Clerkship Director determines the failing evaluation was appropriate, the final grade of Fail is assigned, and the student must remediate the clerkship.
- 5. Clinical Remediation Process (OMSIII and OMSIV):
  - Students who fail a clerkship will be assigned a grade of Fail (F) and referred to the APPC to develop an Academic Development Plan (ADP).
  - The ADP may include additional clinical time with a different preceptor, completion of additional coursework or assignments, retaking the COMAT examination, and other requirements determined by the Clerkship Director.
  - Upon successful completion of the failure remediation, the student will receive a grade of Pass (P\*), indicating a pass after remediation.
  - Students who do not successfully remediate the clerkship failure will be referred for follow-up according to published policies.
