PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Physical Health Services policy is to inform all students, faculty, and staff that the IllinoisCOM offers students does not provide on-site student health services.

POLICY

- The IllinoisCOM does not provide on-site student health services. Students must seek health care through off-campus healthcare providers.
- All expenses for health services are the responsibility of the student.

PROCEDURES

1. Healthcare Resources
 - While the IllinoisCOM does not provide on-site student health services, students may seek healthcare through off-campus healthcare providers.
 - [The Chicago School's Healthcare Resources website](#) provides resources to help students ensure they have insurance coverage and can find healthcare providers in any of the campus locations.
 - Students need to present their insurance card when seeing any healthcare provider. All expenses for health services are the responsibility of the students.
 - Students may seek medical services for acute care of short-term treatment at any of these providers.
 - The Student Physical Health Services Policy (IllinoisCOM_Element 9.9.1) outlines policies and procedures related to access to physical health services for IllinoisCOM students. The proposed IllinoisCOM does not provide on-site student health services. However, students are encouraged to establish health care with a primary care provider local to their training site. Our primary clinical affiliates for initial class training in each of our four main regions are: Rush Oak Park in Chicago, Huntington Hospital in Pasadena, MedCity Dallas in



Dallas/Fort Worth, and Chippenham Hospital in Richmond. The Chicago School's [Healthcare Resources website](#) provides resources to help students ensure they have insurance coverage and can find healthcare providers in any of the campus locations. Students need to present their insurance card when seeing any healthcare provider. All expenses for health services are the responsibility of the students.

- Additional assistance with securing access to physical healthcare services can be directed to the Office of Student Affairs. The Office of Student Affairs will compile, maintain and publish a list of local physical and mental health providers for the four core regional training sites.
 - IllinoisCOM encourages students to establish healthcare with a primary care provider local to their place of training.
